ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

- Matric (grade 12) Certificate or equivalent.
- Two South African languages.
- South African citizen.
- Reading, writing and basic mathematical skills are required.
- Able to read, write, speak, and understand English.

DEPARTMENT TOURISM REQUIREMENTS

All qualified tourist guides must register with a Provincial Registrar appointed by the Department of Tourism (e.g., Gauteng Tourism Authority). This registration is the learner's responsibility and none of these costs are included in the course price. For the registration you must be a South African citizen or have a valid work permit. You will submit a copy of your Tourist Guiding certificate (and Drum Beat Acknowledgement of Result), a valid First Aid certificate, R240 registration fee, and 4 passport size photos. You will also need to complete a registration form and sign a code of conduct and ethics upon registration. Once approved you will receive your guiding badge and card. Registrations are valid for 3-years, registrations can be renewed and updated. (Note: Driver-guides need to be 21 years of age to get their PDP).

DURATION

- Online structured 8-month course.
- 2-day practical weekend to be attended in person on scheduled dates (Pretoria / Johannesburg).

ASSESSMENT

- Practical assessment on Conducting a Guided Experience (via Google Meet). Should you wish to do an in-person assessment this can be arranged in Pretoria / Johannesburg.
- Portfolio of Evidence (assignments & workbooks).
- Questionnaires (tests) on theory and information cards (cue-cards).

HOW IT WORKS

PLATFORM

Conducted via Google Classroom.

WHAT YOU'LL NEED

- Access to a computer / laptop / notebook / tablet.
- Stable internet connection & data.
- Free Google account (Gmail address preferably).
- PDF Reader and Microsoft Office Word.
- Printer / scanner (optional).
- Recording device (e.g., smartphone).

OVERVIEW

With the online course you do not have to be available at any specific time to 'attend class', you can work through the training material, workbooks, & assignments when it suits you. However, it is a structured course and there will be submissions dates for your workbooks & assignments. You will have ample time for theory, research, and task completion. The submission dates are there to guide you towards completion of your course at a steady pace. An extension can be requested for extenuating circumstances.

Not all your material, workbooks, & assignments will be visible when you're invited to your online class (via Google Classroom). With this structured course we will publish new material at a set pace. You must first complete one section before moving on to the next. As you submit your tasks they will be assessed, and feedback given. One module must be completed in full (workbook, assignments, and assessments) before moving on to the next.

Continuous support and mentoring will be available during office hours. Should your facilitator see a need, a Google Meet session will be scheduled with the class to address concerns and commonly asked questions.

STEPS TO FOLLOW

- 1. Complete the enrolment. Choose whether you're paying per module or the full amount as a once-off payment. For both options you must pay the full amount stipulated to gain access to your classroom.
- 2. Email the completed form to pta@drumbeatacademy.co.za.
- 3. We will send you a proforma invoice for your chosen module/s.
- 4. Make payment via EFT / direct deposit.
- 5. Email proof of payment to pta@drumbeatacademy.co.za.
- 6. Upon confirmation that the full (100%) payment has been received, you will be placed on the attendance register for invitation on the scheduled date for the training programme/s.
- 7. You will receive an invitation to join a Google Classroom. Once you've accepted the invitation you will have access to the classroom and your training material.
- 8. Your facilitator will guide and assist you should you have any problems navigating through Google Classroom and your training material.

ESTIMATED TIMELINE FOR REGISTERING AS A TOURIST GUIDE

FET CERTIFICATE, NQF 4

You will have 12 months from the start of your course to complete your qualification and first province. Should you fail to do so, you will be deregistered. Your course fee is non-refundable.

1.	Enrol.	Enrol for CATHSSETA's FET Certificate: Tourist Guiding (71549, NQF 4).	
2.	Module 1.	Complete Module 1 via Google Classroom. Portfolio of Evidence (PoE).	4 – 5 months
3.	Module 2.	Complete Module 2 via Google Classroom. 1 st written exam. Overview of South Africa.	4 – 6 weeks.
4.	Module 3.	Complete Module 3 via Google Classroom. 2 nd written exam. First Province. Verbal Assessment. Practical weekend (can be completed before starting Module 2).	4 – 6 weeks.
5.	Moderation.	Your portfolio of evidence is moderated, and final signoff completed.	2 weeks
6.	Achieve with CATHSSETA.	We achieve you for the FET Certificate: Tourist Guiding with CATHSSETA.	2 weeks
7.	CATHSSETA Endorsement.	CATHSSETA endorses the qualification, issues a certificate number, and sends it off for printing. Printing is completed in batches and not printed per individual. 3 months is the average time from endorsement to issue, though delays can extend the time it takes to issue certificates.	2 - 3 months
8.	Drum Beat Certificate & AoR.	In the mean time we will issue you with a Drum Beat Certificate and Acknowledgement of Result (AoR).	2 weeks
9.	First Aid Level 1.	Schedule and attend your First Aid training with an accredited service provider.	2 days
10.	Module 4 & 5.	Additional Provinces. This is the time to continue with your additional provinces if you chose to do more than one province. Each additional province has one written exam.	2 – 4 weeks per province
11.	CATHSSETA Certificate.	CATHSSETA issues your FET Certificate. It is sorted and sent to the provider (Drum Beat Academy) and we'll let you know when it is ready for collection.	2 – 4 weeks
12.	Register as a Tourist Guide.	Once you have your CATHSSETA Certificate, your Drum Beat Certificate & AoR, and a valid First Aid Level 1 Certificate you can contact your Provincial Registrar for registration as a Tourist Guide.	2 – 4 weeks

- Assessment: Assessment and feedback of your PoE and exams can take up to two weeks.
- FET Certificate & 1st province timeframe: The typical timeframe for completion is 6 8 months depending on the amount of time you have available to dedicate to the course work.
- Total timeline: To register as a Tourist Guide can take 12+ months from the start of your course.
